

Suggestions for improvement are welcome.



PALGHAT

Introduction.

With the enactment of the State's Reorganisation Act of 1956, the Malabar district of the former Madras State and the Kasargod taluk of the former South Canara district in the former Mysore State were combined to form a new Malabar district in Kerala State. On 1st January 1957, this district was divided into three new revenue districts. Among them Palghat was one. Later, portions of Ponnani and Perinthalmanna taluks in this district were separated out to form part of the new district of Malappuram.

The taluk-wise area, population, density, sex ratio etc., of the present Palghat district as per the 1961 and 1971 Census are presented in tables 1.1 and 1.2 respectively. The district covers an area of 4400.0 sq. km. The population as per 1971 Census was nearly 16.9 lakhs persons. Nearly 8.2 lakhs of them were males and 8.7 lakhs were females, sex ratio being 1056.

Unlike the other districts in the Malabar area, this district does not have a sea coast nor does it contain a substantial area under low land. The midland region consists of valleys and plains, noted for the cultivation of paddy, coconut, pepper vine and cashewnut. Beyond the midland, to the east, lies the highland area where plantation crops like tea, coffee and rubber are grown.

Rivers.

Bharathapuzha is the most important river in this district. The entire district is drained by this river and its tributaries. In this river basin, there are several irrigation projects already completed or under construction, important among them being Malampuzha, Walayar and Mangalam.

Soils

There are four different types of soil found in this district, viz. peaty (kari), laterite, forest and black soil. The peaty soil is characterised by deep black colour and is rich in nitrogen and potash. Laterite soil is found in the major part of Ottapalam, Palghat, Alathur and Chittur taluks. Forest soil is confined to the eastern regions of Ottappalam taluk and along the western boundaries of Palghat and Alathur taluks and along the southern boundary of Chittur taluk. This soil is characterised by a surface layer of organic matter derived from forest growth. It is rich in nitrogen. The major portion of the black soil is confined to the eastern sector of Chittur taluk and a small region of Palghat taluk. This soil is ideally suited for cotton cultivation.

Minerals.

Iron ore, lime stone, muscovite mica and amethyst are the important minerals that occur in Palghat district. Iron ore deposits are found in places

like Kollengode, Mannarghat and Muthalamada. The feasibility of the exploitation of this mineral is under investigation. Limestone is found in Chittur and Kozhinjampara areas. Mica deposits are found in Sholayar village while Amethyst exists in places like Kayamnanna, Meenakshipuram and Pallassena.

Climate.

Like other districts of the State, Palghat also has four seasons, viz. the dry weather from December to February, hot weather from March to May South-west monsoon from June to September and the retreating or north-east monsoon from October to November. Generally, temperate climate is experienced throughout the year along the sea-coast while in the eastern taluks it is very hot in the months of April and May.

The rainfall data in the important rain recording centres during the period 1966, 1970 and 1971 are presented in Table Nos. 2.2 to 2.4. There are mainly four seasons. The dry weather seasons commences by the latter half of December and prevails upto February. The hot weather season begins by the first week of March and lasts upto the end of May. The rainfall recorded shows a slight increase during this period. The South-west monsoon begins by the first week of June and continues till September. This wet season is characterised by heavy showers. The north-east monsoon is heavy and establishes itself during the months of October and November. The break of about 30 miles in the chain of hills bordering the eastern portions of this district lets in the north-east monsoon and helps to bring down these rains.

Public Health.

The present district hospital at Palghat started functioning from the year 1860. This was taken over by the Palghat municipality in 1865. The present hospital at Chittur was opened as early as 1883. The local boards which began to function at this time opened hospitals and dispensaries at all taluk headquarters. During 1970-71, there were 9 Government hospitals, 11 primary health centres, 22 dispensaries, 20 leprosy hospitals and 3 dental clinics functioning in this district [vide Table 3.3 (a)].

Vital Statistics.

The latest year for which data on vital statistics is available is 1969. As such it relates to the old Palghat district. Table 3.1 gives the figures.

Education.

1971 Census figures show that among the districts of Kerala, Palghat has the lowest literacy percentage, ie. 46.69. Alleppey ranks first in this respect with a literacy percentage of 70.25.

Of the total 16.85 lakh persons in the district in 1971, 786849 persons were literate. Of these 447333 are males and 339516 are females.

Table 4.1 gives taluk-wise number of institutions for school education. During 1970-71 there were 868 schools for general education, 11 schools for professional education and 2 schools for special education in this district. The total number of students attending these schools came to 3.26 lakhs during 1970-71. Regarding higher education, there are 8 colleges for Arts and Science in this district. This district also possesses one Teachers' Training College and one Engineering College. Data relating to education and cultural education are presented in Tables 4.1 to 4.12.

Printing Presses and Libraries.

Table 4.12 gives the number of printing presses, news papers and periodicals by languages during the year 1970-71. Similarly the number of libraries, their membership, the collection of books and the grants received etc., are presented in Table 4.10.

Agriculture.

Agriculture is the main source of livelihood for majority of the population. According to 1971 census 64% of the total workers comes under the category 'cultivators and agricultural labourers'. The pattern of land use in this district is given in table No. 5.1. Cropped area formed 75% of the total area in this district.

Among the crops grown, rice occupies the foremost place. During 1970-71 182621 hectares of land was under paddy cultivation and the total production during this year was estimated at 315925 tonnes. Groundnut, cotton, pulses, sugarcane, betelnut, banana, tapioca, cashewnut, and coconut are the other important crops grown. Coconut is the most important commercial crop. During 1970-71, 23498 hectares of land were under coconut cultivation in this district and the total production was estimated at 92 million nuts. The entire area of 14692 hectares under groundnut in this State lies in this district. Also cotton cultivation is exclusively confined to this area. During 1970-71, this district had 7258 hectares of land under cotton and the total production was 1292 bales.

Livestock.

The livestock population in this district according to 1971 Live Stock Census is given in Table 6.1.

It is seen that of the total cattle population in the State 279978 (nearly 10%) are found in this district.

This district had 1,44,905 buffaloes and this is 30% of the State total. The combined livestock population in the district came to 568134, which is less than 12% of the total State figures. In the case of poultry, the district had 922471 numbers, which was 8% of the total State Poultry Population.

Cooperative Societies.

The type of cooperative societies functioning in this district and their membership is given in Table 7.2. Details regarding their share capital, deposits, borrowing, loans issued etc., are also given. Data regarding 1970-71 alone are presented since the data for the previous years relate to the old Palghat district. During 1970-71, this district had 100 agricultural Credit Societies, 23 primary consumers societies and 84 other non credit societies.

Industries.

The latest available data relating to the total number of working factories pertains to the year 1969, and obviously it covers the old Palghat district. The number of working factories and employment position in the reorganised Palghat district is not yet available. Hence the data presented in Table 8.1 give only an approximate idea of the industrial set up prevailing in the present district of Palghat.

Employment Exchange Statistics.

The number of applicants on the live register by main occupations group are given in table 9.5. During the year 1970-71, 16376 persons registered their names in this district seeking employment under various occupations. Data for 1970-71 alone is presented since the previous years' figures relate to old Palghat district.

Transport & Communications.

The history of the development of roads started from the second half of the 19th century onwards. The establishment of Malabar District Board had mainly contributed to the building of roads in this district. The latest available road data relate to the year 1967-68, and it covers the old Palghat district.

Railways.

The length of railways in this district is given in Table 11.4. This district is served by both broad gauge and metre gauge lines. After, the formation of the present line called Palghat district, there was a fall in the railway mileage as table 11.4. shows.

Post & Telegraphs.

Most of the villages in this district are served by post offices. During 1970-71, this district had 482 post offices, 85 telegraph offices, and 17 trunk call offices (vide Table 11.3).

Criminal justice.

In this section also, data for 1971 alone is presented, since the details available for the previous years are not comparable. Details regarding the number

of police stations and out-posts the strength of police force in different categories and serious crimes are given in Table 12.

Local self Government.

(a) *Municipalities.*

The Municipalities in this district are governed by the Kerala Municipalities Act, 1960 which came into force on 1st September 1961. The population, income and expenditure of Palghat and Chittur-Thathamangalam Municipalities are given in Table 13.1.

(b) *Panchayat*

During the year 1970-71, Palghat district had 89 panchayats. The income and expenditure of Panchayats are given in Table 13.2. The Panchayats, villages covered and the population are presented in Table 13.3.

Community Development.

The particulars of the Development blocks in this district number of villages covered, area, population etc. are given in Table 16.1.

By the end of March 1971, this district, had 12 community development blocks; this includes a tribal development block at Attappadi. It covers a population of 15.6 lakhs. Of the 12 C. D. Blocks, 8 are post Stage II and the remaining come under Stage II.

Registration.

Table 17.1 presents the details regarding the number of sub-registry offices, number of documents presented, the nature of documents and the number of documents registered during the year 1970-71. Table shows that during this year 26,067 documents were registered and their value came to Rs. 996.48 lakhs.

Small Savings Schemes.

Small Savings collection in this district under various heads for the year 1970-71 is given in table 22.2. Data for the previous years are not given since they relate to old Palghat district. During 1970-71, small savings collections under postal certificate, post office savings, bank and cumulative time deposits were Rs. 11.5 lakhs, Rs. 227 lakhs and Rs. 16.95 lakhs respectively.

This section mainly deals with the area, population and housing, their distribution and characteristics according to 1961 Census. Wherever possible the data from 1971 census have also been included. All the important aspects such as density of population, growth of population, sex ratio, religion, rural urban break up, population by age-groups distribution of households according to tenure, material of roof, number of rooms material of wall etc. have been dealt with in this section.
