SECTION - 2

1.1. Introduction:

This report deals with the results of the enquiry conducted as part of the 18th round of National Sample Survey on the earnings of persons engaged in professions and liberal arts in Kerala State. The Survey was conducted during the period from 1st February 1963 to 31st January 1964. As usual collection of data on the enquiry in the Central Sample was done by the staff of the Directorate of N.S.S., Government of India and that in the State Sample by the staff of the Bureau of Economics and Statistics. The results based on the State Sample data alone are presented in this Report.

## SECTION II.

### 2.1. Object of the enquiry:

The enquiry was designed to collect information regarding general particulars and earnings of employees (including domestic servants) and self employed persons engaged in professions and liberal arts in the rural and urban areas. Persons engaged in professions and liberal arts in institutions or establishments operated by Central Government or State Government local bodies and quasi-government organisation were not included in the enquiry. For the purpose of categorising persons engaged in professions and liberal arts according to their Industry, the industry-wise classification of the Central Statistical Organisation was followed. The enquiry included all industry groups under divisions 8 and 9 of the standard industrial classification of Central Statistical Organisation, 1963 excluding (i) public services under major group 81 (ii) hotel services, etc. under groups 852 and 853 and (iii) professions and liberal arts in establishments operated by government. All persons who follow professions and liberal arts either as principal or subsidiary means of livelihood have been brought under the purview of the survey.

### 2.2. Coverage:

The geographical coverage of the survey was the entire rural and urban areas of Kerala State.

### 2.3. Period of Survey:

The enquiry was conducted as a part of the socio-economic survey of the 18th round of N.S.S. which commenced in February 1983 and continued upto the end of January 1984.

### 2.4. Sampling Design (Rural):

The sampling design in the rural sector was a stratified two-stage one, the census village (1951 census) being the first stage unit and the household being the second stage unit. For the purpose of stratification the state was first divided into two agricultural regions, namely the northern region (comprising the Districts of Palghat, Kozhikode and Cannanore) and the southern region (comprising the remaining six Districts of Trivandrum, Quilon, Alleppey, Kottayam, Ernakulam and Thrissur). The regions were formed by grouping contiguous districts in the state having similar crop pattern and population densities. Strata were formed by grouping together contiguous tehsils or their parts within the same agricultural region such that the sum of the sizes of the villages in each stratum was exactly equal, the size being the 1951/1961 census population of the village rounded off to the next higher multiple of 1000. While forming the strata, information on transport facilities was also taken into account. The rural sector in the State was divided into 15 strata.

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Within each stratum four independent inter-penetrating sub-samples of six villages in each were selected circular systematically with probability proportional to size (size being 1951/1961 census population of the village rounded off to the next multiple of 100) from the 1951 census list of villages as the sampling frame. If the selected village was found to be large, it was divided into convenient number of hamlet groups having equal population and one hamlet group was selected at random for the purpose of detailed enquiry. Altogether 360 villages were selected for this survey in the State.

Within each selected village or hamlet the households were visited and those having at least one member employed in professions and liberal arts as principal occupation or as subsidiary occupation were noted. Using this as the sampling frame the required number of households for detailed enquiry were selected circular systematically. A sample size of 144 households was fixed for each stratum and this sample size was allocated to the sample villages in proportion to the 1951/1961 census population.

The formation of strata, selection of villages in the strata and allocation of households for each village were made by the Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta who made the technical design of the survey.

#### 2.5. Sampling design (Urban):

In the urban sector also the sampling design was a stratified two stage one with urban blocks as the first stage unit and households as the second stage unit. The urban area (as per 1951 census) in the state was divided into two strata (also called sectors), the first stratum consisting of the state capitals and all the towns with a population of 50,000 and above as per 1951 census and the second stratum consisting of the remaining urban area in the State.

The unit of survey in each stratum was called the block. A list of blocks was prepared by the Directorate of National Sample Survey in their Urban Frame Survey (1962). Where this was not available, 1951 census urban block was taken. The total sample size of 144 blocks fixed for the State was allocated to the two strata in proportion to the number of blocks in them giving twice the weightage to the stratum 1.

In each stratum four inter-penetrating sub-samples of blocks were selected. In the first stratum the blocks were selected systematically with probability proportional to the block population rounded off to the next multiple of 1000. In the second stratum the sample blocks were selected circular systematically with equal probability. In the case of a large block, it was divided into a number of sub-blocks having equal population and one sub-block was selected at random.

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From each selected block or sub-block a sample of 12 households was to be selected circular systematically from among the households having atleast one member engaged in professions and liberal arts either as principal occupation, or as subsidiary occupation.

The formation of strata and the selection of blocks were done by the Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta.

#### 2.6. Scheme of work:

The four independent sub-samples were surveyed by two parties of Investigators, one party surveying sub-samples 1 and 3 and the other party surveying sub-samples 2 and 4.

The period of survey of one year was divided into six sub-rounds of two months each. The six villages in each sub-sample of the rural area were serially numbered and the village with serial numbers 1, 4, 3, 6, 5, 2, were taken up for detailed enquiry in the sub-rounds 1 to 6 respectively. In the urban area the blocks with serial number 1, 7, 13 etc. were taken up for enquiry in the first sub-round, those with serial numbers 2, 8, 14 etc. in the second sub-round and so on.

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SECTION III

**3. Concepts and definitions:**

The concepts and definitions followed in the enquiry are explained below.

**3.1. Professions and liberal arts:**

This will include all the industry groups under industry divisions 8 and 9 of the Standard Industrial and Occupational classification of the Central Statistical Organisation (1962) excluding.

- (i) government services (major group 81)
- (ii) professions and liberal arts in establishments operated by government; and
- (iii) hotel services (groups 852 and 853).

The enquiry does not cover Government activity in this sector of economic activity. Therefore persons engaged in professions and liberal arts in institutions or establishments operated by Central or State Government, local bodies or quasi-government organisations are not covered.

For example if in a household there are two gainfully employed persons, namely, a doctor in a private dispensary and a teacher in a Government School, the doctor alone will be considered as engaged in professions and liberal arts and data on his earnings alone will be collected.

The description of the groups coming under professions and liberal arts is given below:

3.2. Professions and liberal arts as principal or subsidiary occupation:

A person will be considered to have professions and liberal arts as principal occupation if the largest share of his total working time during the 30 days preceding the date of enquiry was spent on this occupation. On the otherhand, if a person having some other principal occupation, spends a part of his total working time during 30 days preceding the date of enquiry in professions and liberal arts, he will be considered to have the occupation in a subsidiary capacity.

3.3. Reference period for the enquiry is 30 days preceding the date on which data are collected from the selected households.

3.4. Household:

A household is defined as a group of persons normally living together and taking food from the same kitchen. The inmates of a mess, hostel, hotel, orphanage, vagrant house, etc. are considered as single member household. But the inmates of hospitals, jails, nursing homes, etc. except the residential staff are excluded.

3.5. Household member:

A person will be considered as a member of the household only if he is a normally resident member of the household i.e. one who normally passes Nights under the same roof and takes food from the same kitchen irrespective of his length of stay with the household during the reference period. The domestic servant staying with the household is considered as a normal member even if he/she does not take meal from the common kitchen. Normally resident members exclude guests and include temporary absentees.

3.6. Self employed:

A person will be regarded as self employed in an occupation if he has been working as an employer or own account worker in that occupation in principal or subsidiary capacity. An own account worker may either be a single worker or a joint partner.

3.7. Employment status:

The employment status of a person who is gainfully employed during the reference period of the survey is determined by the following categories:

- i. working in household enterprise as owner operator hiring labour.
- ii. working in household enterprise as owner operator not hiring labour.
- iii. working in household enterprise as working partner hiring labour.

- iv. working in household enterprise as working partner not hiring labour.
- v. working in household enterprise as unpaid helper.
- vi. working for salary or wages.
- vii. not working.

The owner operators or working partners are distinguished from unpaid helpers by the fact that the former have (a) ownership right and (b) the power to take policy decisions regarding the working of the enterprise; while the latter (unpaid helpers) have only either of the two rights but not both.

### 3.8. Employee:

An employee is a person who works for a public or private organisation, an individual or a group of persons. All employed persons other than these classified as self employed will be called 'employees'. This will include unpaid family helper in the household economic activities.

### 3.9. Monthly earnings:

The monthly earnings for a person engaged in professions and liberal arts are calculated by the following procedure:

- (i) Wages and salaries paid in kind are imputed on the basis of ex-farm or whole sale prices or the payer's prices. All perquisites are included in wages and salaries. One twelfth of the bonus paid and the monthly employer's contribution to the provident fund, production loans and profit bonus paid every month are included in the monthly wages and salaries. Facilities such as medical conveyance etc. are not included uniform given is included.
- (ii) In the case of earnings of self-employed persons gross earnings are recorded.
- (iii) The earnings received and receivable during the reference period have been considered both in the case of self-employed persons and employees.

### 3.10. Principal industry of a person:

When a person follows more than one activity, the activity for which the person devotes the highest amount of time during the reference period is taken as his principal industry. Other activities will be his subsidiary industries.

## SECTION IV

### Findings of the Survey:

4.1. The results presented in this report are based on state sample data only. As the complete results of the central sample data are not available the pooling of the central and state sample results has not been attempted.

### 4.2. Number of persons engaged in professions and liberal arts.

The survey results show that 2.53 lakhs persons are engaged in professions and liberal arts during the period of the survey. Among them 2.45 lakhs follow this as their principal means of livelihood while the remaining 0.08 lakhs have it only as a subsiding activity. The corresponding figures obtained from the central sample data for rural areas alone are 2.43 lakhs of persons having professions and liberal arts as their principal means of livelihood and 0.11 lakhs as subsidiary means of livelihood. The following table gives the number of persons engaged in professions and liberal arts as obtained from the state sample and central sample.

Among persons who follow professions and liberal arts as their principal or subsidiary occupations in the state the largest percentage of persons i.e. 27% is seen engaged in Educational Services. Next to this is domestic services which engages about 25% of the persons. It is worth pointing out that the literacy rate in Kerala is very much higher when compared to other states in India and a large number of schools in this state is under private management. Hence it is only natural that the Educational services in this state absorb a sizable proportion of persons engaged in professions and

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liberal arts. About one eighth of the persons are reported as engaged in laundry, services, cleaning and dyeing. Medical and Health services account for about 6% of the total persons. In the rural areas Educational services top the list by absorbing 30% of the persons engaged in professions and liberal arts. In the urban areas Domestic services occupy this place by absorbing nearly 28% of persons. Only about 18% of the total persons in urban areas are seen engaged in Educational services.

4.4. In table 3 the rural - urban break up of the percentage of persons engaged in professions and liberal is presented for each industry group separately.

Considering all the persons engaged in professions and liberal arts it is seen that more than three fourth of them are employed in Rural areas and the remaining in urban areas. In the case of Educational services more than 36% are employed in rural areas. As already point out the employees of the private educational institutions alone are

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covered by the survey and most of there institutions are located in rural areas. In the legal services nearly 40% are working in urban areas. In the Domestic services one third of the persons and in Medical and Health Services nearly one fourth of the persons are employed in urban areas. In the Recreation services nearly 87% are reported as working in urban areas. The percentage of persons working in urban areas is least in the industrial group of Barber and beauty shops.

4.5. The percentage of persons engaged in professions and liberal arts by their employment status is given in table 4 below:-

It is seen that 22% of the persons engaged in profession and liberal arts are booking after their own enterprise without employing any person to assist. Only 6% of the persons run their own enterprises with paid employees. Only about 3% of the persons in their sector run their enterprises in partnership, basis. More than two thirds of the persons in this sector are reported as working for salary and wages. The proportion of salary/wage earners is more in the urban area than in the rural area, the respective percentages being 74 and 66.

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In table 5 the percentage distribution of persons who follow professions and liberal arts as their principal means of livelihood is presented by the various industry groups for the rural and urban areas separately.

For the state as a whole nearly 23% of the persons are engaged in Educational services as principal activity the corresponding percentages being 30 in Rural areas and 18 in urban areas. One fourth of the persons are seen engaged in domestic services. Laundry services, clearing and dyeing account for one eighth of the total persons. In the remaining services the percentage of persons engaged is below 8. In the case of Medical and Health services, legal services Business services, Recreation services and Domestic services the percentage of persons working is higher in urban areas than in rural areas.

4.7 In table 6 the rural urban break up of the percentage of persons who follow professions and liberal arts as principal means of livelihood is presented.

It is seen that nearly 77% of the persons engaged in professions and liberal arts as their principal means of livelihood in the state is employed in rural areas, and the remaining 23% in urban areas. However it is seen that in the case of other community services and Recreation services comparatively larger proportion of person are reported from the urban areas than from the rural areas.

4.3 In table 7 the percentage distribution of persons engaged in professions and liberal arts as principal means of livelihood are presented by their employment status.

About 68% of the persons are working for salary and wages. The patterns of distribution in the various categories is more or less the same as that noticed in table 4. in the case of the total population following Professions and liberal arts as their principal and subsidiary means of livelihood.

4.9. In table 8 the percentage of persons following professions and liberal arts as principal means of livelihood and those following it as subsidiary activity are presented for each industry group separately.

It is seen that about 3% of the total persons engaged in professions and liberal arts follow it as a subsidiary activity. The largest percentage of persons who follow professions and liberal arts as subsidiary means of livelihood seen in the industry group of religious services which includes about 12% of the persons in that service. The least percentage is reported in Domestic services.

4.10. Proportion of persons following professions and liberal arts as principal means of livelihood and of these following it as subsidiary activity with various status of employment activity is given in table 9 below:-

The percentage of persons following profession and liberal arts as a subsidiary means of livelihood is pronounced only in the category of unpaid family helper reporting about 32% of the persons while in all other categories it is less than 8%.

4.11. The data collected from the survey indicate that the average earning for a period of 30 days for a person engaged in professions and liberal arts as his principal means of livelihood, is Rs.71.30 in the State. The corresponding figures for the rural and urban areas are Rs.64.04 and Rs.95.09 respectively.

The average earning is the largest (Rs.198.93) in the legal services followed by medical and health services (Rs.185.44). The least earning is recorded in laundry services sector of Industry, the figure being Rs.28.27.

In the rural sector the average earnings per person engaged in largest profession and liberal arts is in the case of recreation services (Rs.222.09) followed by the medical health services (Rs.376.01) followed by legal services (310.63) and it is for lowest in the case of domestic services (Rs.36.36).

The largest earning of a male member is Rs.210/- from the Industry Recreation Services followed by legal services (Rs.197) and medical health services (184). In the case of females the largest earning is from the legal services (Rs.54.8) followed by Medical and health services (Rs.212). For the State as a whole the earning of a female worker is only Rs.48/- where as that of a male worker is Rs.86/-. In the case of medical and health services the average earnings of females is lesser than Males in urban areas while

The least earning is reported from Laundry services, the figures being Rs.23.65.  
In the urban areas the average earnings per person engaged in largest professions and liberal arts is in the case of medical and Health services.  
In the case of medical and Health services, the figures being Rs.125.30.

the reverse is the case in the rural areas and when the State as a whole is considered. In respect of the remaining industry groups the same trend is noticed in the case of rural and urban areas with regard to the relative earnings of males and females.

4.12. The average monthly earnings for a person following professions and liberal arts as his subsidiary means of livelihood is given in table (11) for the various industry groups.

The average monthly earning for a person following professions and liberal arts as his subsidiary means of livelihood works out to Rs.59.67 for the State; the rural areas Rs.86.31 for the urban area. For the State as a whole the largest per capital earning (Rs.167.20) accrues from the Educational Services. This is so in the rural areas as well as urban areas. It is interesting to note that the average income of a person who is engaged in Educational services is only Rs.108/- in the case of person who follow this as his principal means of livelihood and Rs.167 for persons who follow this as a subsidiary means of livelihood.

4.13. The average monthly expenditure on materials for self-employed persons in professions and liberal arts for the various groups of industries is given in table (12). The costs refer to the amount paid or payable during the reference period of 30 days. The monthly cost on materials per each self-employed person has been worked out for various industry groups irrespective of whether he works in it as his principal activity or as subsidiary activity. The results obtained show that the average monthly cost on materials for each self-employed person in the State is Rs.11.93. The cost on materials is found to be maximum in recreation services which is Rs.135.90 per month per person.

4.14. The average monthly cost towards repairs and maintenance charges for all capital items possessed by self-employed persons in professions and liberal arts is given in table (13). The average cost has been arrived at by considering all the self-employed persons irrespective of the principal or subsidiary status of employment. The average monthly cost per person comes to Rs.1.60.

4.15. The average monthly expenditure per self employed person towards other operational cost is given in table(14). This will not include payments made to the regular employees of the enterprise and will include expenditure on items like payment of external agencies for services, printing, stationery, advertisement services, brokerage commission transport, postage etc. The average monthly expenditure per self employed person in the state towards these items works out to Rs.2.29.

4.16. The average monthly expenditure incurred on account of hired labour in professions and liberal arts by self-employed persons engaged in the enterprise either as their principal occupation or as subsidiary occupation is presented in table 15. Both cash and kind payments are considered for the purpose. Payments made in kind are imputed on the basis of current wholesale prices. It is found that the average monthly expenditure incurred on this account by a self employed person is Rs.4.22. The corresponding expenditure is found to be Rs.3.64 in the rural area and Rs.16.52 in the urban area.

4.17. Expenditure of self employed persons in professions and liberal arts towards rent on land and buildings is given in table (16). In the case of rented land and buildings the actual rent paid or payable during the reference period is taken. In the case of land and building owned by the self employed persons, the rental value is imputed on the basis of the current rates of rent, prevailing in the locality. Rent paid or payable for other capital items like machinery, furniture etc. is also included in working out the total expenditure on rent. The data analysed reveal that the average monthly expenditure incurred by a self employed person towards rent is Rs.13.34. The corresponding figures for the rural and urban areas are Rs.3.43 and Rs.64.81 respectively.

4.18. Interest charges for loans taken by self employed persons for running their enterprises are given in table(17). The monthly interest paid or payable during the reference period is considered. In the case of capital owned by the self employed persons the imputed value of the interest payable during the reference period is included in this item. It is seen that on the average a self employed person has to pay interest charges of Rs.0.77 during a month of 30 days. The corresponding figure for the rural area is Rs.0.53 and that for urban area is Rs.2.57.
