


Preface

Only in the past four decades have the attention of national societies and the world community been drawn to the social, economic, political and scientific questions raised by the phenomenon of aging on a massive scale. In 1950, according to United Nations estimates, there were approximately 200 million persons 60 years of age and over throughout the world. By 1975, their number had increased to 350 million. UN Projections to the year 2000 indicate that the number will increase to 590 million, and by the year 2025 to over 1,100 million; that is, an increase of 224 percent since 1975. During the same period, the world's population as a whole is expected to increase from 4.1 billion to 8.2 billion, an increase of 102 percent. Thus 45 years from now the ageing will constitute 13.7 percent of the world's population.

Old age people-age 60 or above - constitutes about 9 percent of the total population of the state. The development Kerala achieved in the fields of social sectors helped the state to achieve a special Kerala Growth Model. Indices on birth rate, death rate, life expectancy, quality of life, literacy etc vouch this growth. This has contributed in lengthening of life span with average longevity going well beyond seventy, which was only about half at the time of independence, there by increasing the percentage of old persons from 7.5 in 1981 to 9 percent in 2002.

The break up of joint family system and evolution of nucleus families, shift from an economy based on Agriculture to service sector, migration of large number of persons from their home villages to in and outside of the state and to other countries in search of job and lively hood, have lead to a situation leaving most the aged back in the homes alone, which is posing different socio economic problems.

Considering all factors, the department of Economics and Statistics has proposed a survey of aged persons in Kerala. The survey covered 3020 wards. Such a massive operation was never taken up till date on this subject.

The Quick Tabulation report, prepared soon after the field survey, reveals some interesting findings. The field staff of the department under the able guidance of the Deputy Directors in the districts prepared the Quick Tables. The support given by Taluk Statistical Officers/Statistical Inspectors is worth mentioning. Shri .Nandasoonu M.A of Computer Division provided computer assistance including programming for the final output he deserves a bouquet. Shri.P.Kochu Narayana Pillai, Joint Director (Survey & Designs) designed the output tables and prepared this report within record time. I would like to place on record the excellent services rendered by Shri.P. Kochu Narayana Pillai.

The final report under preparation would reveal more useful information with regard to Aged in Kerala and Old Age Homes. I hope this report is useful to policy makers, Government departments and NGOs serving in the field of social sector.

Report on the Survey of Old Age Citizens

The phenomenon of proportionate increase in the numerical strength of senior citizens has become very prominent in recent times, worldwide as a result of concerted efforts on development. The more advanced technologies for health care are employed in a country, the higher will be the ratio of older people to the total population in that country.

- 2. Kerala is a land of high literacy and mainly as a result of this healthcare is given high priority by the people and the Government. In this State enrolment in primary schools is said to be as high as in West Europe and infant mortality rate is as low as in New York. Here life expectancy is high and the percentage of older people in the total population is also on a par with the most advanced countries.
- 3. The increase in the percentage of those who have passed the age of sixty creates its own socio-economic problems. The advanced countries have taken up several measures to tackle these problems. The need for taking up such measures in this State is felt. The present survey is intended to assess the magnitude of the problem and to identify areas which require remedial measures.
- 4. The peculiar situation in the State has been brought about by several factors.
 - a) The transition from traditional joint families to modern nucleus families.
 - b) The economic shift of the population from the agriculture sector to the secondary and tertiary sectors, especially in rural Kerala.
 - c) The spread of professional and technical education, coupled with shortage of avenues of employment locally, resulting in migration of youth in search of sophisticated employment in cities in other states and outside India.
 - d) The high priority attached to healthcare in the state, resulting in longevity of life and in rousing life expectancy about two times.
 - e) The peculiarity of the Kerala habitat pattern in which every Keralite dreams of an independent house, however small, enclosed by a courtyard. With the migration of children to cities and elsewhere the elderly people are left alone in their independent homes, which accentuates their loneliness and resultant problems.

- f) On the one hand, the old people are not prepared to live in homes away from their traditional households; on the other hand the younger generation, who are forced to move to distant places in search of livelihood, are unable to live with their parents and look after them. As a result the average family size is less than five. The older people are forced to live a life seclusion, away from their loved ones.
- It was against this background that Government in G.O Rt317/02/plg dt 31/10/2002 decided conduct of a survey on aged citizens in Kerala.
- 6. Methodology: The Survey was conducted during the period of January to April 2003. It was conducted along with the 7th Agricultural Census, covering 5% of the households in the State. The selection was made by using multi stage stratified sampling method, with probability proportion.
- 7. The following points were covered in the Survey.
 - a. Family background of the aged citizens.
 - b. Their education, earlier employment, present income.
 - c. Problems of health, type of healthcare assistance.
 - d. Facilities in the habitat, arrangements for stay food.
 - e. Arrangements for their physical care.
 - f. Behavior of other members of the family.
 - g. Whether any children are working abroad and their details.
 - h. Their time use pattern.

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- 8. A provisional estimate of the results of the survey, consisting of a few important indicators like number of old age persons, number of households with old age persons, number of such persons staying alone, number of those having children employed abroad etc. are tabulated and published as a quick report.
- 9. The Survey covered inmates of old age homes, registered and recognised, as well as unregistered. But this quick report does not cover the data relating to these old age homes or their inmates.

10. Summary of findings:

- a. There were a total of 69.09 households of which 83.28% are in rural area. The maximum is in Thiruvananthapuram (11.58%), Followed by Ernakulam (10.7%). The lowest is in Wayanad (2.50%), the next higher is Kasaragod (3.33%).
- b. There were 21.61 lakhs houses with old age persons, which is 31.27% of total households. Maximum is in Ernakulam (2.33 lakhs) followed by Thrissur (2.30 lakhs).
- c. There were 26.16 lakhs senior citizens. Ernakulam tops with 2.94 lakhs followed by Thrissur (2.84 lakhs). The male female combination was 12.42 lakhs and 13.73 lakhs making the sex ratio 1106. The sex ratio is maximum in Kannur (1222), followed by Thrissur (1204). Idukki is the only district where the males out number the females (sex ratio 972).
- d. There were 15.11 lakhs households with senior citizens as head of household. Which is only 21.87% of the total households and 69.92% of households with old men. Thrissur tops with 1.75 lakhs followed by Thiruvananthapuram with 1.59 lakhs.
- e. It can be seen that out of 1000 households there are aged persons in 313 houses.


 The maximum is in Pathanamthitta (404) and the minimum in Wayanad (211)
- f. In 1000households there were 379 old persons. This also is maximum in Patanamthitta (503), followed by Alappuzha (480).
- g. Per 1000 households 219 were having senior citizen as head of household. The maximum in Thrissur (274) is followed by Kannur (270). The minimum is in Wayanad (147).
- h. There were 49578 houses with old men, alone which is 2.29 %, the maximum in Thiruvananthapuram (7171) and minimum in Kasargod (944).
- i. In 2.24 lakhs houses sons/daughters are working abroad which is 10.35% of the total. The maximum (19.36%) is in Malappuram and the minimum in Idukki (1.74%)


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
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
